What business are we in?

Let me ask you a question, "What as a church have we not noticed lately?" I know that this is really an odd question, how can you notice what you haven't yet noticed. Let me illustrate what I mean.

It is the year 1910. This is the age of the big transatlantic steamer. The seas were full of big beautiful ships carrying the thousands of people to and fro across the Atlantic. The dominant companies in this business are Cunard and White Star. If you ask the people who ran Cunard and White Star what business they were in, they would of inevitably responded: *"The transatlantic shipping business"*.

Sadly it was that kind of self-definition that sealed their demise. Locked into a worldview that the future was about bigger, faster ships, companies like Cunard and White Star were busy trying to create ships with bigger engines, more funnels, and iceberg-proof hulls. Yet, only a few years later a disruptive technology came along and sunk the transatlantic shipping business and the White Stars and Cunards of the world. That piece of technology was of course, the airplane.

If White Star and Cunard had seen their business from a different perspective in other words not as a transatlantic shipping business, but rather as a transatlantic *people moving business* things might be very different today. Instead of flying in *Virgin* and *BA* and *easyJet* planes we might all be flying in Cunard and White Star planes.

How often as churches do we get the question: "What do you do?" All too often we respond to questions like this with the 'what,' and forget to mention the 'why' we do what we do. We invariably answer the question on autopilot and talk about parishes and worship services, social activities etc. In other words we talk in terms of the logistics of church and the location of church buildings.

When Jesus was asked a similar question in Luke's Gospel (ch15), instead explaining what he was doing he told 3 stories that helped his listeners 'see' why he was doing what he was doing. From beginning to end every thing Jesus did was *people focused* – not property or procedure focused. It is good to be able to explain *what* we do but let's never forget the *why*. Why not take some time this week to read and reflect on how Jesus answered those who questioned him about his activities. Like its Saviour, the Church is called to be first and foremost a people-centred enterprise. If we forget to notice that we may like Cunard and White Star find ourselves replaced.

LINTON LIFTS [Proposed]

Slow but sure progress is being made towards the formation of a voluntary drivers scheme to take residents of West Linton and surrounding area, to and from health-related appointments.

Journeys by public transport are challenging when it comes to getting to BGH and other places patients of the West Linton Health Centre are referred to. The Red Cross did a grand job ferrying people back and forth, using volunteer drivers, but that organisation no longer runs the service, and Linton Lifts hopes to fill the gap. However, as with most not-for-profit organisations, a Steering Group needs to be recruited before we can attract volunteer drivers. To that end, I am looking for the following:

Co-ordinator/s to deal with client bookings and communications with drivers, using designated email and mobile phone - these people need to be available during the day. A **Treasurer** to receive monies from clients, make payments to drivers, and manage funds - using electronic banking with the Bank of Scotland (once an account is set up) and manage insurance. A **Secretary** to arrange and minute meetings, and keep secure records. **Committee members** - two or three, to help with publicity, social media, press, training etc.

Volunteering can be very satisfying, and I would love to hear from anyone reading this who feels they may be able to help fill any of these roles, or indeed may know of someone who perhaps is looking to fill a gap in their lives following retirement or change of lifestyle.

I know that some will be wondering about driving – rest assured, I will put the call out for more drivers when we have a steering group formed! As for clients – there will be no shortage!

Scripture or Bible Cake

- 1. Butter 8oz Judges 5:25. She brought forth butter in a lordly dish.
- 2. Sugar 8oz Jeremiah 6:20. To what purpose cometh there to me incense from Sheba and sweet cane from a far country.
- 3. Honey 1 tblsp 1 Samuel 14,:25. And all they of the land came to a wood: and there was honey on the ground.
- 4. Eggs x 3 Jeremiah 17:11. As the partridge sitteth on eggs.
- 5. Raisins 8oz 1 Samuel 30,:12. And they gave him a piece of a cake with two clusters of raisins.
- 6. Dried figs 8oz Nahum 3:12. All thy strongholds shall be like fig trees with the first ripe figs.
- 7. Almonds 2oz Numbers 17:8. Behold the rod of Aaron bloomed blossoms and yields almonds.
- 8. SR Flour 1lb 1 Kings 4:22. Solomon's provision for one day is 30 measures of fine flour.
- 9. Season to your taste with spices. 2nd Chronicals 9,:9.-neither was there any such spice as the queen of Sheba gave king Solomon.
- 10. Add a pinch of salt. Leviticus 2:13-with all thine offerings thou shalt offer salt.
- 11. Baking powder 1 level teaspoon. Amos 4:5. Offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving with leaven bread.
- 12. Milk 3 tablespoons. Judges 4:19. She opened a skin of milk and gave Him a drink.

Method

Cream 1,2 and 3. Beat 4 and add gradually. Mix in 5, 6 and 7. Mix 8,9,10 and 11 together then add. Finally add 12 and mix well. **Bake in the oven at 160 for 1 ½ -2 hours.**

Contributed by one of our readers. The Editor, who loves cakes, has tried it (half quantities) and baked it in a loaf tin. The results from the tasting panel were all positive. He substituted dates for the figs (2 Samuel 6:19) and used ginger and mixed spice for seasoning.
